Organizational Accomplishments 2008—2009

- Advocates provided 550 women, 24 men, and 579 children with crisis intervention in abusive relationships.
- Advocates provided 34 primary victims and 22 secondary victims with crisis intervention in situations involving sexual assault.
- Our shelter provided safe housing to 90 women and 79 children.
- Advocates assisted 156 women, 10 men, and 131 children in obtaining Orders For Protection and 56 women, 4 men, and 29 children in obtaining Harassment Restraining Orders. A total of 17 orders were written with victims of sexual assault.
- Advocates provided 770 women, 41 men, and 594 children with safety planning. Safety plans were also provided to 72 primary sexual assault victims and 60 secondary sexual assault victims.
- Keep Me Safe! Parenting Time Center monitored 226 visits for 68 children with their non-custodial parents. Due to a higher demand for supervised visitations, Keep Me Safe has expanded its hours.
- Information and referrals were provided 12,250 times to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault on resources available in the community to address legal matters, counseling, therapy, housing, child care, and employment and internal resources including support groups, shelter, and Keep Me Safe Program.
